Guidelines for Abstract Preparation

Abstracts should be written in English and should not exceed two A4 size pages (3.0 cm margins) in length, preferably in Times Roman 12 pt. font. In general, the maximum length including any references will be approximately 100 lines single-spaced; 700 words; 7500 characters). Authors are requested to either submit the abstract as an MS Word file attached to an email, or to by mail 5 copies of the abstract text, and a CD-R. Files should preferably be MS Word 6 or higher version or rich text format, named using the author's last name at the beginning of the file name. In general, authors should prepare their abstracts according to the Uniform Requirements for manuscripts submitted to biomedical journals, also known as the **Vancouver Style**.

In addition, authors are requested to adhere to the following guidelines:

- Line 1: Title (bold and flush left)
- Line 2: Name of Author(s) (flush left)
- Line 3: Institution or Department with complete address including postal code, telephone number and fax number if available of the first author (flush left, no breaks or line breaks).

Leave one blank line between the address and the first paragraph and between paragraphs. No other blank lines are permitted.

Text (flush left, no tabs or indents, no skipped lines).

Standard abbreviations may be used without definition. Other abbreviations must be defined by placing them in parenthesis after the full word the first time they appear. Avoid abbreviations in the title.

Vague statements such as "A...will be discussed." should be avoided.

Statements of the basic methods and quantitative statements of results must be included.

References in the text (up to 10) should be indicated by numbers in brackets corresponding with the alphabetical reference list at the end of the abstract. Examples of references for a journal article and a chapter in a book:

Remlot BP and Luddy PW. Diseases of the severely immuno-deficient mouse. In: Weber RO, and Hedberg AC, eds. *Fundamentals of transplantation surgery*. Yorktown: WB Saunders Company, 1990:967-72.

The deadline for abstract submission is: **January 20, 2008**

The file name for abstracts should begin with the last name of the first author. The email submission may be by the first author or by the corresponding author as indicated by the originating email address. All communications will be with a single corresponding author.
